Premises and After School Club/Breakfast Club Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Staff in the After School Club to be asked to support children with using the online homework system - Extra rubbish collection agreed for the summer months at both schools 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children who attend the After School Club are able to access the homework and are completing work daily - The build up of rubbish over the summer was far less than in previous years due to the increased collections





Finance and Personnel Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Risk assessments to be completed for staff where DBS checks have not yet been received and certificates are out of date - The Christmas Fair ice rink was paid for by the school with a view for all profit to go back into the school - The Health and Safety Policy was updated and agreed in line with new guidance - The toilets at William Morris are in poor condition and require updating and repairing. Governors considered costs for two or four blocks for repair and agreed it was cost effective to replace four blocks in KS1 over the summer 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Children were safeguarded and staff felt confident to work within the school environment - £2,000 profit was made from the Christmas Fair, which will go back into the school towards the cost of the next fundraising project - The Health and Safety Policy is live and in place across the Federation - The children return to school in September with newly refurbished toilets in KS1. The KS2 toilets will be looked at and planned for the next academic year

Curriculum and Standards Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Governors considered and agreed the School Improvement Plan priorities for both schools - Monitoring of the attendance and persistent absence percentages at both schools and consideration of actions going forward - Governors discussed and considered the greater impact safeguarding is having on the school - Regular monitoring of the phonics outcomes at both schools and the percentage of children who are likely to meet the standard. Actions and interventions identified and considered 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The School Improvement Plan priorities for each school are live and being used for the strategic development of the Federation - More children are in school daily and robust systems are in place to ensure absences are recorded, checked and followed up - Governors are more aware of the impact of safeguarding on staff and resources - Both schools met the target set for this year and are above the National target for the percentage of children achieving the phonics standard in Year 1
