Pupil premium children have performed better than non-pupil premium children in reading, writing and Mathematics, with more pupil premium children working at secure+ in these areas; however as there are no pupil premium children exceeding in reading, writing or Mathematics, the non-pupil premium children have performed better in these areas.

Pupil premium children have made better progress than non-pupil premium children in reading, writing and Mathematics, with 100% of pupil premium children making expected progress.

Year 6 – There were no pupil premium children in Year 6.

Target areas:

Pupil premium children have performed significantly below non pupil premium in the following areas:

Progress

- Year 3 reading and Southwark class in reading, writing and Mathematics
- Year 4 reading, writing and Mathematics
- Year 5 Mathematics and Barbican class in reading, writing and Mathematics

Attainment

- Year 2 children exceeding in reading, writing and Mathematics
- Year 3 reading at secure+
- Southwark class reading, writing and Mathematics at secure+
- Year 4 in reading, writing and Mathematics at secure+
- Year 5 writing and Mathematics at secure+
- Barbican class reading, writing and Mathematics at secure+

Progress of pupil premium children is generally in line with non-pupil premium children in Key Stage 1, with pupil premium children making the same or more progress in all areas. However, progress in Key Stage 2 is lower for pupil premium children compared to non-pupil premium children in most areas.

Attainment in some classes is significantly lower for pupil premium children than for non-pupil premium children, particularly in Key Stage 2. Attainment of pupil premium children in Key Stage 1 is generally in line or above that of non-pupil premium children.
