Apply their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to read and understand new words

Understand what they read, in books they can read independently, by:

- drawing inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence

- identifying main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph and summarising these

Understanding of the World

HISTORY: The Roman Empire

Learn about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain

This could include:

- Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC

- the Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army

- successful invasion by Claudius and conquest, including Hadrian's Wall

- British resistance, for example, Boudica

- 'Romanisation' of Britain: sites such as Caerwent and the impact of technology, culture and beliefs,

- including early Christianity

SCIENCE: Sound

Pupils should be taught to:

- identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating

- recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear

- find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it

- find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it

- recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

Use animated presentation software to deliver messages

Compare and evaluate two different examples of presentation software

Use a variety of media to create and refine a talking book appropriate for the target audience

Combine the use of different digital devices

Use photo editing software for effect
